Ruby and Paula are gearing up to be their own bosses through multi-level success magnet FYZZLE Cosmetics when a small dog, a medium amount of blood, and a box of loose powder conspire against them.

DIRECTOR STATEMENT

Poof is a chaotic fever dream born out of my obsession with MLM culture and tenacious women.

Ruby and Paula are working class warriors and newly-minted saleswomen for corporate giant FYZZLE Cosmetics. The film opens moments before Ruby's online business launch as Paula tries to coach Ruby towards grace & grandeur. These women are unknowingly up against a system designed against them but they have grit in their guts and broaches on their pantsuits.

For me, Multi-Level Marketing (pyramid) schemes are a perfect microcosm for the crumbling tower of the American Dream - those on the top get richer, those on the bottom get bloodier. In a country chock full of people hanging on by their fingernails, there is consolation in the companionship you find at the bottom - and hope in the thought of a better life waiting in the wings.

As a director, I wanted to create a small garden of everyday America. I wanted the film to take place in one room with wood paneling and two powerhouse actors. I wanted to write a funny, furry love letter to ambitious people who are swimming against the current. I wanted to create a juxtaposition between the warm forest of actual human connection; and the cold, fluorescent promise of fame and fortune. A promise that appears and disappears swiftly and suddenly - POOF!

But mostly I wanted these women to win, on their own terms, in their own perfectly imperfect way.

Poof is a plummet into the 9 minutes before the rest of your life. It is a meditation on celebrity, capitalism and fancy ketchup. It is the story of friendship amidst the clutter. And the hope, however ill-fated, that sometimes arrives at your door in a box of powder.




MARGARET MILLER DIRECTOR / CO-WRITER

She is also known for producing numerous shorts, most notably POOF (Cannes), DRESS A COW (SXSW), THE ROBBERY (Sundance), and Alden Ehrenreich's SHADOW BROTHER SUNDAY (Tribeca). Metzger is currently the Vice President of Production & Development at Vanishing Angle. Metzger holds an MFA from California Institute of the Arts and is a Summa Cum Laude and Phi Beta Kappa graduate of Emory University, where she received the Sudler Award in the Arts and the Pioneer Award.
